Referral guidelines

All practitioners caring for adults with a life-limiting illness should provide general palliative care. The specialist palliative care teams can offer help & advice with the following problems:

- complex physical symptoms
- complex psychosocial & family issues
- spiritual distress
- bereavement
- rehabilitation

If you need help with a patient who may not meet the criteria above, we can offer support & advice to aid decision-making, as well as offering staff training as required.

Specialist Palliative Care Services in the Essex Cancer Network area

- **Community Specialist Palliative Care Team** – specialist palliative care (Macmillan) nurses supported by a multidisciplinary team, offering symptom control, support & advice to patients & their carers in the community. Referrals are accepted at any stage of the patient's illness.

- **Hospital Specialist Palliative Care Team** – specialist palliative care (Macmillan) nurses supported by a multidisciplinary team, offering symptom control, support & advice to patients & their carers in the hospital setting. Referrals are accepted at any stage of the patient's illness.
- **Hospice admission for a planned period of short-term care** – admissions are accepted on the basis of need and can provide symptom control, respite*, psychosocial support, rehabilitation & end of life care. Please note that hospices cannot provide long-term care for palliative care patients.
- **Bereavement support** – support from trained staff where relatives or carers are assessed to be at risk of a complicated bereavement.
- **Chaplaincy** – spiritual & pastoral support to patients & carers of any or no faith.
- **Complementary therapies*** – a selection of therapies including aromatherapy, massage, Shiatsu, reflexology & acupuncture.
- **Day Care** – offers an holistic patient assessment & physical, psychological & social support, positive living programmes & complementary therapies.
- **Hospice at home*** – practical advice & support at home in the last few weeks of life, enabling the patient to remain at home (24 hour service).
- **Lymphoedema services*** – assessment & treatment of those who have developed lymphoedema as a result of their illness &/or treatment.
- **Occupational therapy** – aims to enable patients to live their lives as fully as possible by detailed assessment, advice on lifestyle management & provision of specialist equipment as required.
- **Outpatient services*** – medical, nurse & physiotherapy led outpatient clinics, including blood tests & transfusions, bisphosphonate infusions & breathlessness clinics.
- **Physiotherapy*** – aims to maximise patients' physical function & improve their quality of life by a detailed assessment & management plan.
- **Social Work & Counselling*** – provides emotional, psychological, social & practical advice & assessment for patients, families & carers in the community & hospice settings.
- **Therapists*** - art & music therapists enabling patients to express themselves creatively.

***Please note that not all services are currently available in all parts of the Essex Cancer Network.**

Other professionals are involved in supporting palliative care patients, e.g. GP's, District Nurses, Oncologists, Clinical Nurse Specialists, Marie Curie Cancer Care.
